Rules for Undergraduate Projects

- The duration of the undergraduate project course is one academic year, with three credits each in the first and second semesters.
- A student not applying for the Undergraduate Student Research Project by NSTC shall participate in an off-campus competition and submit their works thereto. The submission period of the entries shall fall within the course duration. If the rule of a competition requires a qualification where a preproposal should have been accepted, such pre-proposal will be deemed as participation in the competition. If the pre-proposal has not been accepted, the student shall still complete the work a follow the above rule.
- A student has to make a poster of his or her project and participate in the exhibition, as well as to brief the project (oral presentation) in the briefing held by the department.
- A student has to submit the project works, which shall be presented in code or
 physical hardware design and clearly displayed on the poster. If a student fails
 to display his or her works, the semester grade of the senior project course
 will be zero.
- Change of projects in the course duration is allowed, subject to the advisor's consent.
- If the project is suspended without reason, the grade will be zero.
- A student has to submit a end-of-semester checklist for project.
- Undergraduates have to attend 8 speech seminars of the graduate school each semester. They have to take notes in the seminars and hand in the print-out after the seminars. Those who are 30 minutes late for a seminar will not be allowed to attend (that seminar will not be recognized).

- Those who apply for the **Undergraduate Student Research Project** by NSTC (at least one student in a group has to submit an application).
 - o Applicants have to provide the submitted research proposal.
- Those who does not apply for the Undergraduate Student Research Project
 - The students shall participate in competitions and submit works.
 - The submission period of the entries shall fall within the course duration.

- If the rule of a competition requires a qualification where a preproposal should have been accepted, such pre-proposal will be deemed as participation in the competition. If the pre-proposal has not been accepted, the student shall still complete the work a follow the above rule.
- Whether a competition is national level shall be determined by the project advisor.
- Participation in international or national academic conference activities
- Submission of papers to SCI or SSCI journals (one paper can only be used by one group of students, cannot be counted multiple times).

Grouping

• One teacher will act as a project advisor of no more than two groups with two students in each.
